- 7 RELATES TO: KRS 321.203, 321.205, 321.235, 321.236
- 8 STATUTORY AUTHORITY: KRS 321.235(1)(b), 321.236(1)(b)
- 9 NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: KRS 321.235(1)(b) requires the Kentucky
- 10 Board of Veterinary Examiners to promulgate administrative regulations to effectively carry out
- and enforce the provisions of KRS Chapter 321. KRS 321.236 requires all allied animal health
- 12 professional (AAHP) facilities to register with the Kentucky Board of Veterinary Examiners.
- 13 KRS 321.236(5) requires each registered AAHP facility to identify both an AAHP manager and
- each registered responsible party who shall be responsible for the operation and management of
- 15 the AAHP facility. This administrative regulation establishes the responsibilities for registered
- 16 responsible parties and AAHP managers.
- 17 Section 1. Definitions.
- 18 (1) "Allied animal health professional" or "AAHP" has the same meaning as KRS
 19 321.181(1).
- 20 (2) "Allied animal health professional facility" or "AAHP facility" has the same meaning
 21 as KRS 321.181(2).

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1	(3) "Fixed facility" has the same meaning as KRS 321.181(38).
2	(4) "Mobile facility" or "mobile unit" has the same meaning as KRS 321.181(46).
3	(5) "Registered responsible party" has the same meaning as KRS 321.181(57).
4	Section 2. Registered Responsible Parties. A registered responsible party shall
5	(1) Be responsible for maintaining minimum standards as promulgated by the board in
6	administrative regulation;
7	(2) Designate an AAHP manager for the registered AAHP facility;
8	(3) Ensure the requirements of KRS Chapter 321 and 201 KAR Chapter 16 are met in
9	addition to all local, state, and federal laws governing operations at the veterinary facility;
10	(4) Comply with all duties to report, in accordance with Section 4 of this administrative
11	regulation, including the timely designation of an AAHP manager for the facility; and
12	(5) Ensure compliance with minimum AAHP facility standards promulgated by the board
13	in administrative regulation, as applicable to the registered AAHP facility.
14	Section 3. AAHP Manager.
15	(1) An AAHP manager shall:
16	(a) Be responsible for maintaining minimum standards as promulgated by the board in
17	administrative regulation;
18	(b) Maintain a Kentucky Board of Veterinary Examiners AAHP permit in good standing;
19	(c) Comply with all provisions of the Kentucky Veterinary Medicine Practice Act and
20	201 KAR Chapter 16, in addition to all local, state, and federal laws governing operations at the
21	AAHP facility;
22	(2) The AAHP manager shall be:
23	(a) The individual who oversees AAHP services at the AAHP facility;

1	(b) Knowledgeable about the AAHP facility, its:
2	(i) Daily operations,
3	(ii) Standard protocols,
4	(iii) Drug supplies,
5	(iv) Patient areas,
6	(v) Storage structures,
7	(vi) Other organizational spaces, and
8	(vii) Parts and spaces, both indoors and outdoors, of the AAHP facility;
9	(c) Present at the AAHP facility with enough frequency to have knowledge of and control
10	over the facility's methods for complying with minimum standards and the degree to which the
11	minimum standards are being met; and
12	(d) Available and responsive to the board, its staff, inspectors, or other board designees,
13	in the event of a facility inspection or any inquiry or investigation by the board.
14	Section 4. Duty to Report. Either the registered Registered responsible party parties or
15	and AAHP managers shall report to the board:
16	(1) Within thirty (30) days, any Any change of name, address, phone, or email to the
17	registered AAHP facility within thirty (30) days by completing and submitting to the board the
18	Request for Facility Information Name or Address Change form or online equivalent form,
19	including all required attachments, provided by the board;
20	(2) Within ten (10) days, a A change in the AAHP manager for the registered veterinary
21	facility within ten (10) days by completing and submitting to the board a Request for a New
22	AAHP Manager form or online equivalent form, including all required attachments, provided by
23	the board; <u>and</u>

(3) Any infraction of KRS Chapter 321 or 201 KAR Chapter 16 by themselves or another 1 person at the AAHP facility within fifteen (15) days; and 2 (4) A written response to a grievance or inquiry from the board within twenty (20) days 3 of receipt, pursuant to 201 KAR 16:610. 4 Section 5. Registration and Inspection of Allied Animal Health Professional Facilities. 5 6 (1) Each AAHP permittee and AAHP facility or mobile facility shall be subject to KRS Chapter 321 and 201 KAR Chapter 16. 7 (2) During a facility inspection or investigation, the board or its designee shall be 8 9 provided unrestricted access to animal use areas. (3) Inspections of an AAHP facility shall be limited to the animal treatment areas unless 10 the board or its designee is accompanied by at least one representative from the professional 11 licensing board or certifying body in the human area of specialty. 12 Compliance and Disciplinary Action. Registered responsible parties and AAHP 13 managers shall comply with KRS Chapter 321, 201 KAR Chapter 16, and other applicable 14 federal, state, and local laws, or shall be subject to disciplinary action pursuant to KRS 15 321.235(2)(h) or 321.351. 16 Section 6. Separate Human and Animal Treatment Areas Required. 17 (1) An AAHP permittee who treats both animal and human patients in the same 18 registered facility shall: 19 20 (a) Post a conspicuous sign in the reception area of that facility informing customers that 21 nonhuman patients are treated on the premises; 22 (b) Maintain a separate, non-carpeted room for the purpose of practicing on animal 23 patients;

- 1 (c) Utilize separate furniture and equipment for use with animal patients which shall not
- 2 <u>be used for human patients;</u>
- 3 (d) Apply appropriate biosecurity measures to
- 4 prevent contamination and the spread of zoonotic disease;
- 5 (e) In the event of an animal bite, protocols to
- 6 <u>follow... reporting requirements, etc.</u>
