7 STATUTORY AUTHORITY: KRS ...

8 NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: KRS 321.175 states the purpose of the
9 Kentucky Veterinary Medicine Practice Act is to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the
10 animal population and the citizens of Kentucky. KRS 321... requires the Kentucky Board of
11 Veterinary Examiners to promulgate administrative regulations as it may deem necessary and
12 proper to effectively carry out and enforce the provisions of KRS Chapter 321, This
13 administrative regulation establishes minimum standards for temporary clinics and high volume
14 spay/neuter operations.

15 Section 1. A registered responsible party and the veterinarian manager shall ensure compliance
16 with this administrative regulation.

17 Section 2. Requirements for Temporary Clinics and High Volume Spay/Neuter Operations.

18 1) A temporary clinic or high volume spay/neuter operation shall comply with the standards
19 established in 201 KAR 16:705, Sections 1 through 6 and with the requirements of this
20 administrative regulation.

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- 1 2) A temporary clinic or high volume spay/neuter operation which operates out of a mobile unit
- 2 shall comply with the standards established in 201 KAR 16:710.
- 3 3) All temporary wellness and high volume spay/neuter clinics shall be limited to occurring only
- 4 within the confines of a registered veterinary facility, with the exception of mass rabies
- 5 immunization clinics allowable under KRS 258.043.

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
